

Dear Mr. Collver and Board Members,

As you may know, California Education Code Section 1240 requires that the County Superintendent of Schools visit schools in deciles 1-3, as identified by the 2012 Academic Performance Index (API), and report the results of these reviews to governing boards. I am submitting this summary of the 2013 visits for your review at your next regularly scheduled meeting in November. This report concerns the visit to **Fortuna High School** on September 13, 2013.

The purpose of the on-site review as specified in California Education Code 1240 was to:

- 1. Determine if students have "sufficient" standards-aligned instructional materials in the four core subject areas (English language arts, mathematics, history/social science and science (including science laboratory equipment in grades 9-12)) and, as appropriate, in foreign languages and health;
- 2. Determine if there is any facility condition that "poses an emergency or urgent threat to the health or safety of pupils or staff"; and
- 3. Determine if the school has provided accurate data on the annual school accountability report card related to the sufficiency of instructional materials and the safety, cleanliness, and adequacy of school facilities, including "good repair."

The law further requires that the County Superintendent:

- 1. Annually monitor and review teacher misassignments and teacher vacancies in schools ranked in deciles 1-3 (2012 Base API),
- 2. Receive quarterly reports on complaints filed within the school district concerning insufficient instructional materials, teacher vacancies and misassignments, and emergency or urgent facilities issues under the Uniform Complaint Procedure; and
- 3. Review audit exceptions under expanded authority in the areas of use of instructional materials program funds, teacher misassignments, and information reported on the school accountability report card and determine whether the exceptions are either corrected or an acceptable plan of correction has been developed.

Uniform Complaint data and audit findings are not mandated parts of this report but we are including information on Uniform Complaint Procedures because these items were reviewed as part of the team's site visit. Information on audit exceptions, if any are relevant to items specified above, are not available for review until January.

Before proceeding with the report, let me define some basic terms:

- "Sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means each pupil, including English language learners, has a standards-aligned textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home.
- A school facility condition that poses an "emergency or urgent threat" is a "condition that poses a threat to the health or safety of pupils or staff while at school.
- "Good repair" means the school facilities are clean, safe and functional as determined pursuant to the school Facility Inspection Tool (FIT) developed by the Office of Public School Construction or a local evaluation instrument that meets the same criteria. Each school district that receives state funding for facilities maintenance is required to establish a facilities inspection system to ensure that each of its schools is maintained in "good repair."

Below are the findings from the visits to the school related to the items which we are required by law to review. Specific details in the three required areas can be seen on the attached visitation report documents.

### Fortuna High School

### **Instructional Materials**

Instructional materials were sufficient in all classrooms visited except Physics which was short 5 textbooks and Physical Science which was short 48 textbooks. It was noted than an English 1 class was piloting new materials for the Common Core State Standards instead of using the district adopted textbook. A Purchase Order for missing textbooks was provided after the visit. It is recommended that the school consider utilizing the library to checkout textbooks rather than teacher checkout to assist in the accountability of textbooks returned at the end of the year.

### **School Facilities**

While the overall school is maintained in good repair, there were 11 non-critical deficiencies noted. Most deficiencies related to broken sinks, drinking fountains, an exit sign light and light diffusers. Other deficiencies related to dry rot and a blocked emergency exit.

### School Accountability Report Card

Information on the SARC was found in English but not in Spanish on the school website. It was complete and had been updated with the 2011-12 template which was sufficient at the time of the review. Since the Hispanic group at the school is greater than 15%, the SARC is required to be posted in Spanish as well as English and should be done immediately for the 2011-12 data. Both versions will need to be updated to include required data for 2012-13 before February 1, 2014.

### Teacher Misassignments and Teacher Vacancies

All teachers were reported to be Highly Qualified Teachers. A full review will be done by the County Office of Education in the spring.

### **Uniform Complaint Procedures**

Required UCP notices were posted in English in each classroom. The school needs to have a Spanish version of the UCP in each classroom since the Hispanic population greater than 15%.



The following were the audit findings for 2012-2013:

- 1) Student Body Account Expenditures Internal Controls: Instances of questionable disbursements to students in the form of cash awards through a club account and several reimbursements paid without adequate detailed invoices.
- 2) Attendance: The bell schedule used to generate East High School's ADA was not entered correctly in Aeries causing the District to overstate the 2012-2013 ADA by .91 (P2) and 1.06 (Annual). The error was the inclusion of passing time (10 minutes) in the instructional time calculation. The potential overstatement of the District's 2012-2013 revenue limit is \$5,500.



We are excited to have the possibility of having a fully upgraded / faster internet speed with our partnership with CR at Academy of the Redwoods.



## **Challenge Day Scholarship**



- 9. Over the break the 5<sup>th</sup> version of the Leaky Milk Can alumni football game took place. The game between Ferndale and Fortuna raised approximately two thousand dollars for Fortuna's football program. Unfortunately the game was won by Ferndale 14-0 which gives them an overall edge 3-2 in the series.
